Beagles can be predisposed to the following ailments. Examinations twice a year and routine diagnostics to catch problems early, when they are easiest to treat, are recommended for the life of your dog. For more information about your pet, talk to your Banfield medical team.

Glaucoma

Description

Glaucoma is a very painful condition in which fluid in the eye cannot drain as fast as it is being produced, leading to excessive pressure. The pressure crushes the lining of the retina.

Early Detection

Recommended: comprehensive exams twice a year, intraocular pressure check.

Why Needed

Glaucoma can contribute to:

- Extreme pain
- Squinting
- Watery, irritated eyes
- Swollen or bulging eyes
- Blindness

Prolapsed Third Eye (Cherry Eye)

Description

Dogs have a third eye lid that contains a gland that produces about 1/3rd of the tear fluid for the eye. If this gland becomes sore and swollen it protrudes in the corner of the eye.

Early Detection

Recommended: ophthalmic examinations twice a year. Contact your veterinarian immediately if you notice any swellings in or around the eye.

Why Needed

A prolapsed third eye can contribute to:

- Pain
- Swelling, swollen and red eyes
- Dry eyes
- The need for surgery

Epilepsy

Description

Epilepsy is a brain disorder where abnormal electrical activity triggers seizures. The seizures are triggered by abnormal electrical transmission from the nerves to the muscles specifically.

Early Detection

Recommended: twice a year neurological examinations.

Why Needed

Epilepsy can contribute to:

- Seizures
- Temporary disorientation
- Other injuries during or shortly after the seizure
- Drowning if your dog has access to a pool
- Behavior changes
